could say other clubs are envious of their leadership and success as former players maintain an important role in the running of the Bavarian club.

Over the years they have been accused of weakening the league as many of their successful players such as Robert Lewandowski, Niklas Sule, Manuel Neuer and Leon Goretzka came from rival clubs. According to a source from TransferMarkt, Borussia Dortmund have bought more players from rivals than any club in Bundesliga despite spending money on rival players, they have not been able to meet the success like Bayern which could be down to management or the lack of drive. Many ex-rival team players such as Gnabry and Goretzka have proven even more successful after the switch to Bayern.

As another transfer window comes around, Bayern will be looking to strengthen their squad, securing the signature of German talent Leroy Sané. Having already secured young Schalke goalkeeper Alexander Nübel.

As of July 2^{nd,} 2020, Leroy Sané has signed a 5-year contract with FC Bayern München as confirmed by Bayern officials.

With the way they are currently playing under former assistant manager Hansi Flick, there is no doubt that with the young talent they have in their ranks and with

reinforcements that they surely will continue their winning ways in Germany and Europe for a long time to come.
