It seems that the Jonas Brothers needed to break up in order to come back stronger and closer than ever.

The break was really essential and hopefully it will mean this comeback has made them stronger than ever."

The brothers admitted that they needed to "heal and grow" in a recent interview before they were able to reunite as a band. The Jonas Brothers formed in 2005 and became global singing sensations off the back of Disney TV movie Camp Rock. Days after their reunion news, they announced they are teaming up with Amazon Prime Video, the group will be putting together a documentary film that will focus on their lives as individuals as well as them preparing to go on tour.

Tamara Martin, 20, expresses her excitement for the comeback "It's such a wonderful thing to see the young and talented boys who were part of my childhood from the Disney days, grow into outstanding men who have created such a great legacy and left us all reeling in wait for their return after they disbanded several years ago...
